

Parking: Most participants will be parking in the field outside of the main gate. People will be allowed to drop their gear off near their campsite and then go back out and park. A <u>LIMITED</u> number of parking permits will be issued for the lots inside camp primarily to Cuboree Volunteers. Two vehicles per Pack camping in Boy Scout World will also be issued parking permits. Parking will NOT be permitted in the circle adjoining Cub World or on the road in Boy Scout world due to emergency access issues.

Check In:

Cubmasters will check in at the <u>Dining Hall</u>. Cuboree packets and camp maps will be provided at that time. **Medical forms** will be required at Check-in. Plastic cups will be distributed - <u>please bring a sharpie to write names on cups</u> and if you need a carabineer, don't forget to bring one.

Cracker Barrel / Leaders' Meeting:

At least one, up to three representatives from each Pack are expected at the Cracker Barrel (leaders' meeting) on Friday evening at 8:30 p.m. We will have some munchies and coffee, and discuss any changes in the program as well as duty assignments for the remainder of the campout. Please plan to turn in medical forms at Cracker Barrel if you did not at check-in.

First Aid Station

There will be a First Aid station at the Cabin behind the Dining Hall, but there are no "full-time" volunteers on hand. In the event of a medical emergency, please dial 911. In the event of a medical need that does not rise to the level of emergency, please contact the on-call medical staff at the phone number provided or Camp Chairman Michael Husak at 704-264-5893.

Inclement Weather

In the event of rain, all activities will proceed as scheduled. Please instruct your Packs to plan accordingly and bring wet weather gear. <u>In the event of lightning</u>, outdoor activities will be cancelled and Scouts should gather under structures closest to the campground until the all clear is sounded.

Lunch:

Lunch will consist of a sandwich (turkey or ham), apples and cookies. If you have concerns about this menu, please plan to provide your own lunch on Saturday. No other meals will be provided. Each pack needs to have at least 1 volunteer per 20 participants arrive at the dining hall 10 minutes before their scheduled lunch period.

Dutch Oven Dessert Competition:

All Packs / Scouts are encouraged to participate in our Dutch Oven Dessert competition. We have a few Dutch Ovens on hand, so please let us know at check-in if you need one! Turn in your entries at the Dining Hall on Saturday evening at 7:00. Dessert entries must have a recipe card attached (so we can distribute a recipe book after the event).

Adult Showers

The pool shower facilities are off-limits to all youth after 10:00 p.m. and before 6:00 a.m. These are the designated times for adults to take showers at any of the camp shower facilities.

Religious Services

There will be a short chapel service on Sunday morning prior to the Closing. Packs should attend in Class A Uniform.

Events/Activities:

Pack events provide an opportunity for fun for participants. Events will be organized in a rotation. Units will be assigned to a specific rotation. If you choose not to attend all events, please ensure you don't encroach on others' time in a particular station by trying to do something outside of your time slot. Water will be available at all stations - ADULTS ONLY should work the water jugs (to ensure less waste).
